District 32 CPC/PI COMMITTEE

COMPOSITION

The District 32 CPC/PI committee is composed of members representing the groups in District 32 and of interested members of the groups from District 32. Two years of sobriety is suggested for committee members.

A Committee Chair and Alternate Chair will be elected by Third Legacy procedures at the District elections and serve a term to run coterminous with the District officer positions. The suggested requirements for these positions are 1) a current CPC/PI committee member and 2) two years sobriety.

SCOPE:

- 1. Perform CPC/PI functions and services in accordance with the Twelve Traditions of A. A., the A. A. Service Manual, and GSO CPC and PI Guidelines.
- 2. Perform CPC/PI functions and services to fulfill A.A.'s primary purpose of carrying the message to the still suffering alcoholic, through the sharing of information about the AA program and its traditions with:
 - a) those professional groups and individuals that have contact with the still suffering alcoholic.
 - b) the media and other public information channels.
- 3. Foster mutual understanding and cooperation between the Fellowship and others who are concerned about the problem of alcoholism or others wishing to help the alcoholic who still suffers
- 4. Increase the awareness of AA members, professional groups and organizations, and the general public within the District, on ways AA cooperates with professionals and the public, while not affiliating, as set down in the A. A. Traditions and the CPC and PI Guidelines.
- 5. Review, periodically, the committee's composition, scope and procedures, and recommend modifications to the District for approval.

PROCEDURES:

- 1. All committee meetings will be open to members of the fellowship but closed to the general public, unless a special open meeting is called or the committee invites an outside guest.
- 2. The committee will meet at a frequency to be decided by the committee itself. Notice of meeting times will be communicated to the fellowship.
- 3. The committee will respond to requests from the public and professional organizations within the district for information in accordance with established CPC and PI guidelines.
- 4. The Committee Chair, and in their absence the Committee Alternate Chair, will assure that the District Committee and the GSRs are kept abreast of committee work by presenting oral and written reports at each District meeting.
- 5. The committee will consider agenda items in the committee's scope. All proposed committee projects, along with expected budgetary impact, will be presented to the District Committee for approval, before proceeding.
- 6. Once approved by the district committee, the operation of a project will be the responsibility of the committee, which will be expected to provide ongoing progress and plans to the District Committee.
- 7. All committee votes will require 2/3 vote for approval, as suggested in page 52 of the AA Service Manual, on the topic of Substantial Unanimity.
- 8. The DCM, or in their absence, the alternate DCM, should be encouraged to participate in the committee meetings.
